This shall be a traveling type tournament whereby each bowling center recognized by the Greater Roanoke Area USBC Association shall participate. There shall be one tournament at each of the participating GRAUSBC centers and a final tournament that rotates between centers. The feature of this tournament is the awards. These shall be in the form of scholarships to be given as a result of each tournament and the final. 100% of scholarship fees are returned to the junior bowlers. Bumpers will be awarded with medals or trophies.

All participants must be sanctioned USBC bowlers and current members in good standing in a league. Handicap shall be based on 90% of 200 for all bowlers. All ties shall be broken by a ninth and tenth frame roll-off with handicap.

No abusive language, body gestures, or physical abuse towards bowling equipment or bowlers will be allowed. No bowling equipment or clothing with slogans representing foul language, sex, alcohol, or tobacco/vaping products will be allowed. No hats or headgear will be allowed. Bowlers in such cases will be disqualified immediately and tournament fees will not be returned.

A bowler must use his/her highest current sanctioned average and must have bowled a minimum of 6 games for the first-time bowling. For bumpers the minimum will be 2 games. All bowlers will then continue to use their current league average for each remaining tournament. All bowlers must have a league secretary verified average at each tournament. Any bowler without this verification will be ineligible to bowl. It will be the responsibility of a coach or youth league officer from each center to provide average verification each tournament.

One group shall consist of male and female youth 12 years and younger, another group shall consist of male and female youth 13 years and older and another will consist of male and female youth sanctioned as bumper bowlers. Ages are based on the bowlers age as of August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022. If a bowler's birthday is during the season, they will continue to bowl in the division they started in. There is no age requirement for the scratch division. There must be 5 bowlers signed up for the scratch division to have this division, prior to the start of the tournament. (Bumper bowlers are not eligible.)

For 12 & younger and 13 & over each bowler shall bowl 3 games. The top 5 bowlers shall advance to a stepladder roll-off in each of the handicap divisions. There will not be a roll-off in the scratch division. How you finish in the scratch division will be the standings. For bumpers each bowler shall bowl 2 games. Winners will be determined by total pins with handicap.

Each center tournament will pay out 1<sup>st</sup> place \$100, 2<sup>nd</sup> place \$75, 3<sup>rd</sup> place \$50, 4<sup>th</sup> place \$25, and 5<sup>th</sup> place \$10 in each handicap age group. The scratch division will pay out one or more spots based on the amount of money collected that day. Bumper bowlers will receive medals or trophies for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Certificates will be given out for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> places in each handicap age group. The final tournament in April will pay out to the top 5 bowlers who make the roll-off in each division and will be paid out as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> place \$200, 2<sup>nd</sup> place \$100, 3<sup>rd</sup> place \$75, 4<sup>th</sup> place \$50, and 5<sup>th</sup> place \$25 in each age group for a total of \$900. The points championship, in each age group, is based on the youth bowler with the highest points after the first 4 tournaments and will be paid out as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> place \$115, 2<sup>nd</sup> place \$90, 3<sup>rd</sup> place \$65, 4<sup>th</sup> place \$40, and 5<sup>th</sup> place \$30 for a total of \$680. Bumpers are not eligible for the points championship.

All bowlers not available to bowl at the scheduled times will not be allowed an entry. Eligibility for the final tournament will be based on an achieved points system. Points will be accumulated at each tournament. **15 points are required to bowl in the final tournament.**

**Points System**

FIRST PLACE	=	15 points	
SECOND PLACE	=	13 points	
THIRD PLACE	=	11 points	PARTICIPATION POINTS = 3 points
FOURTH PLACE	=	9 points	BONUS FOR ATTENDING ALL 4 TOURNAMENTS = 3 points
FIFTH PLACE	=	7 points	HIGH GAME (with handicap) = 1 point
SIXTH PLACE	=	5 points	100 PINS OVER THREE GAME AVERAGE LESS HANDICAP = 2 points
SEVENTH PLACE	=	3 points	
EIGHTH PLACE	=	1 point
